# New Lecturers in Experimental Particle Physics

Applications are invited for two new Lectureships in Experimental Particle Physics in the Department of Physics, Queen Mary, University of London. One appointment may be made at Reader level.

The successful candidates will already have shown outstanding research achievements or potential, consistent with their current career points, and be experienced in working in forefront international particle physics collaborations. They will be expected to make significant contributions to the activities of the Particle Physics Research Centre through leading roles in major international experiments.

The Group's major current activity is preparing for the analysis of the ATLAS experiment at the LHC, the construction and exploitation of the T2K experiment and preparations for upgrades to the ATLAS tracker and trigger. We are particularly interested in strengthening academic involvement in T2K and ATLAS upgrades but all candidates will be assessed on their merits and proposed programmes of work. The lectureships are available from March 2009. The salary will be at the appropriate point within the Lecturer or Reader scale, including London Allowance, namely between £37,332 and £54,983 per annum.

Candidates must be able to demonstrate their eligibility to work in the UK in accordance with the Asylum and Immigration Act 1999.
